


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

## COMMISSIONERS' REPORT.

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The Commissioners of Sullivan County submit their Annual Report containing the transactions of the Superintendent of the County Farm, a list of the paupers supported at the farm, and a statement showing the cost per week of each, together with the amount of aid furnished County paupers away from the farm during the year.

The Commissioners desire to call the attention of Overseers of the Poor in the several towns to the necessity of guarding well the interest of the County in furnishing aid to County paupers, and see that all supplies are furnished at the market value and are used for the benefit of the County, requiring all bills to be fully itemized as to quantity and price; and also in the employment of physicians to treat those that are sick; to employ physicians residing near the parties that are sick, instead of allowing the paupers to employ those at a distance.
